



RENEWAL: Going Native

A photographic exploration of Florida native plants

The Palm Beach County Chapter of the Florida Native Plant Society (PBCC FNPS) is seeking sponsors for **Renewal: Going Native**, a large-scale photo exhibition of museum quality imagery of Florida's native flora. The exhibit is being mounted and hosted by the Palm Beach Photographic Centre in its beautiful museum/gallery in downtown West Palm Beach.

The size of the exhibition will depend on the level of financial support. We hope you will be among our supporters.

Renewal: Going Native will feature up to 100 Florida native plant images by well-known native plant photographers from Palm Beach County and throughout the state. The exhibition will include images up to 20" x 24" and mural size, ranging from intimate portraits of individual plants, to wildlife interactions, to natural and planned landscapes.

The three month exhibition will run from May 14 through August 4 (evening reception date to be determined), and is expected to attract many viewers, as the opening coincides with PBCC FNPS' Annual Native Plant Auction at Mounts Botanical Garden, a presentation by acclaimed entomologist Dr. Doug Tallamy, author of *Bringing Nature Home: How You Can Sustain Wildlife with Native Plants*, at FAU's Kaye Performing Arts Auditorium in Boca Raton, and the Florida Native Plant Society's annual conference in Miami.

Renewal: Going Native will be a celebration of the City of West Palm Beach's recently revised landscape ordinance that highlights and rewards the use of native plants in public and private landscapes.

The exhibition will be an opportunity for the public to appreciate the beauty of Florida's native plants and the birds and pollinators who depend on them, and will vividly demonstrate PBCC FNPS' proclamation, "Native plants are the gateway to sustainability."

- The City of West Palm Beach revised landscape ordinance that encourages and rewards the use of Florida Native Plants in new landscapes
- The Florida Native Plant Society annual conference in Miami

PURPOSE:

- *Inspire* people to see the resonant, natural beauty of Florida's native plants

 - Require less water and lower maintenance
 - Extend the benefits of natural areas into private gardens and urban settings
 - Support local birds and pollinators
- *Motivate* people to become stewards of the land, to treasure the remaining natural areas, and to plant natives in private and public landscapes
